Financial Management: I have experience of creating fundraising strategies and managing budgets, cash flow forecasts for NPO organizations, monitored on a weekly basis and in turn reported on quarterly to trustees. I have also set up systems to monitor expenditure levels against agreed budgets for project activities with income monitored against budgets to ensure targets are being met.

For many years at Brouhaha International ensured the financial systems and structures were in place that met the criteria for the control of resources from a wide range of local, national and international public funders, trusts and foundations and private sector sponsors. These systems were established in response to monitoring and compliance requirements of individual funders and as a result of a commitment to ensure value for money and best practice in financial management.

Resource Development: Through my networks and contacts I have been able to develop relationships with a wide range of organizations and funders that have resulted in increased visibility, resources, arts projects and events.
